#### **DESCRIPTION**

Jerusalem in the 1920s. A man descends a staircase. Another man follows him, while hiding his face as he is afraid of being captured on film, an act which he imagines would cause him to lose his soul. At the market, one of the men buys a few things. A horse passes. In the distance, we see the tower near the entrance which leads to Jaffa. The author offers us a series of images, slowed down and edited into loops, evoking a more peaceful past and provoking a gentle nostalgia.
