DESCRIPTION

We follow the crazy journey of a rebellious individual in the face of a world that takes him nowhere. He searches for a path, an explanation of the world, a way to communicate with others, but instead finds himself alone, his freedom out of reach. His suicide and the renouncing of his will symbolizes his integration into the world. The text, used in tandem with images of the young man roaming the city searching for himself and trying to understand what his relationship with the world involves, is combined with an original soundtrack by Jean-Romain Clark.
